

3.13 Fives


Aim: To explore the difference between competition and cooperation.

Skills: Concentrating, looking, listening, cooperating

Age: 7-11

Stage 1: Competitive Fives.

- Everyone in the circle stands up.
- Choose someone at random to start (you could use lollipop sticks to make sure it is fair).
- Ask this person which way around the circle they would like to go.
- This person starts by saying 1. The next person continues with 2, the next 3 and so on up to 5.
- Whoever is 5 has to sit down and is out of the game. People can say either one number or two numbers but not more than that, so it could go:



In Competitive Fives you will end up with one winner.

Stage 2: Cooperative Fives:

- The next time around give two people something to hold like a Koosh ball or a bean bag.
- The game proceeds in the same way but this

time the circle works cooperatively so that the two designated people must still be standing at the end of the game.

 In this case people will have to put themselves out to make the game work.
