

ONE DAY WORKSHOPS FOR KS2 PUPILS

Peace-themed workshops that shine a light on important global themes, whilst making connections to children's everyday lives.







Step 1: Choose A Theme

All workshops take place in your school. Children are taken through a journey to explore peace within, peace between, and peace throughout, and to develop peace-building skills such as cooperation, critical thinking, participation and leadership. Step 2: Select a Year Group

We can work with a KS2 Year Group [of up to 3 classes] in one day, or with a smaller group [minimum of 12 children]. Ideally, we will have access to the hall, the classrooms and your outdoor space, but we can adapt to work within the guidelines of your COVID-19 risk assessment.
