He threw my bag over the fence/ He threw my bag and it went over the fence.

She told the teacher that I broke it **because she wanted** to get me into trouble.

She told the teacher that I broke it.

She pushed me and **made me drop it because she hates me**.

She pushed me/ knocked into me and I dropped it.

He didn't tell me it was somebody else's coat, he **never** tells me anything.

I didn't know it was somebody else's coat.
